Many of the books were outdated including the encyclopedias which were over 30 year old. He plans to use his Splash Grant money to purchase a new set of encyclopedias. By having the encyclopedias in his classroom he can assign research-based projects without relying on a very limited amount of time in the library and computer lab.
