Brandon Sethi and Quentin Wherfel are teachers at Urbana Middle School. They purchased an Elmo Document Camera with their combined Splash Grant money. The document camera is an excellent tool for the classroom because it allows for rich and in-depth interactive presentations. Teachers can literally take anything, and then project a sharp image of it for all students to see. For example, it can capture a digital image that then can be stored and modified to use over again. Or, a teacher wanting to show a map in a textbook can focus on it, project it and even zoom-in on a small area. And, text from any book can be projected for the entire class to see, eliminating the need for making hundreds of copies. The Elmo Document Camera is a wonderful, versatile piece of technology for the 21st Century classroom.
